## SAINT OF THE WEEK

**St. Germaine Cousin**  
**Feast Day June 15<sup>th</sup>**

St. Germaine was a little crippled girl born in the remote French village of Pibrac in 1579. She endured a wretched



life as an unwanted child of the family because she had a deformed hand and the disease of scrofula (infection of the lymph nodes in the neck). A shepherdess who lived in the stable, was dressed in castoff rags and never given a pair of shoes. Her feet were frost-bitten in winter and bloody in the summer. Her only refuge was the Church. There she heard Mass every morning. She was gifted with a

marvelous sense of the presence of God. She was known to be generous to everyone with the little she had. Patronage: abandoned people; abuse victims; against poverty; disabled people; girls from rural areas; illness; impoverishment; loss of parents; shepherdesses; sick people; unattractive people; physical therapists
